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Autism Services







H-N REACH is recognized as a local leader in community education, advocacy, inter-sector collaboration and Community Service Planning. This is H-N REACH's second offering of fee-for-service in Autism programming. The goal is to provide a range of evidence-based services and programs to individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder and their caregivers in a family-centred and flexible manner.

Each service will be evaluated to ensure it is valued by families and future offerings will be modified to ensure the best services are offered at times that work best for families. Feedback will be welcomed. Most services will have a fee attached that must be paid up front but there will be a number of complimentary activities initially.

The World of Autism Services continues to change as families are invited to apply for their OAP family budgets and then purchase the services that best meet their needs. The services H-N REACH offer will be based on the principles of Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA). The services will vary across intensity, whether they are delivered individually or in a group, and whether they are directed to the child or the parent.

Fee for Service Behavioural Intervention

Comprehensive Early Learning Package For Children 2-5 Years Old

Children up to age 6 will receive one-to-one intervention for 12 hours per week. Programming is developed by an experienced Senior Therapist (ST) and supervised by a Board Certified Behavioural Analyst (BCBA). This service includes a curriculum assessment, programming, generalization, progress report and parent training.

Some sessions may be grouped with other children working on similar goals.

Cost: \$850/week; \$9500/12 weeks

Focused Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA)

Focused ABA therapy works to reduce challenging behaviour and/or develop new skills. Each service will include a comprehensive assessment, goal setting, intervention, parent coaching and a summary report. All intervention will be implemented by an Autism Clinician and overseen by a BCBA Clinical Supervisor.

Cost: \$70/hr Packages can be developed based on the number of hours requested.

Behavioural Consultations

A consultation (previously called a clinic) can be arranged with a qualified Autism Clinician to discuss challenging situations and or behaviors. This service will include one consultation session and up to two follow up appointments. Materials, such as visual schedules and tip sheets, may be provided. This will be overseen by a BCBA.

Cost: \$100

Behavioural Coaching

A feedback session can be arranged with a qualified Autism Clinician to discuss challenging situations including establishing routines, increasing independence and getting skills back on track. This service will include one consultation session and up to two follow up appointments. Materials, such as visual schedules and tip sheets, may be provided.

Cost: \$75





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6 - 9 Years Old

Developing Play Dates

Learn how to develop and structure a play date for maximum success This support includes one two- hour prep session and two 90-minute hands on sessions with another child. The development of visuals if needed, is included.

Cost: \$125 for 3 sessions

10 - 13 Years Old

Individual Social Support

This service offers one to one sessions to review social tips regarding conversational skills, using humour, inviting friends to get together, being a good sport, or handling teasing. Three goals are set at the request for this service, followed by one session on each topic. Each 90-minute session will contain activities like games, discussion and practice.

Cost: \$125 for 3 sessions

Groups				
2 – 5 Years Foundations of Learning – Pre- School/School Readiness	Children will participate in a 12-week group program with a focus on increasing self-help skills, group and routines, social interaction, play and leisure, pre-academics, and more. A 2-hour group will be offered each week. Every other week the family will be provided with a 90-minute consultation with a qualified Autism Clinician to assist with skill generalization. All programming is overseen by a BCBA Clinical Supervisor. 6 – 9 Years	Children are provided the opportunity to develop age-appropriate play and social skills in a safe, fun and inclusive environment with staff facilitation. Each block of sessions will focus on a specific theme. Program runs once a week for 10 weeks.

Respite workers and Community Coaches may benefit from learning about Autism Spectrum Disorder and Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA). Proactive behaviour strategies can set children and youth up for success. Using transitional warnings, first then, redirection and following the child's lead may prevent meltdowns and make time away from families more enjoyable.

When problem behaviours arise an Autism Clinician can help problem solve strategies to get activities back on track. Visuals and Social narratives can help explain to a child what is going to happen next. As well an Autism Clinician can offer suggestions of appropriate activities or games that may be appropriate.

Workshop Descriptions

Sexuality and Relationships

Relevant Ages: Teenagers

This workshop will focus on providing caregiver education to assist with teaching the changes that come with puberty and increased interest in sexuality and relationships. We will be discussing such topics as sexual relationships, sexual orientation, dating, boundaries, and consent.

Job/Volunteer Readiness

Relevant Ages: Teenagers

The Job/ Volunteer Readiness will target job readiness skills, employer expectations, identifying personal strengths and weakness, job expectations, & formulating answers to job interview questions. The workshop is designed for both youth and parent/caregiver to attend.

Managing Behaviour

Relevant Ages: All

What do we need to know in order to address common behaviours in children, teens and young adults with ASD? This workshop is designed to help you look at factors that influence your child's behaviour and provides you with effective strategies to help manage misbehaviour.

Learning & Being Social Through Play

Relevant Ages: Preschool and early school age

Learn how to engage children with autism in play-based activities. Learn the distinguishing factors related to play development of both typical children and those with autism. Strategies to teach play, suggestions of toys to use, structuring play and teaching skills such as turn-taking and sharing, initiating greetings and co-operative play will be covered.

**This workshop separated into 2 parts: the first will be a parent/caregiver portion presentation in the upper boardroom at the EarlyOn in Simcoe and the second portion will include child & caregiver on the main floor of the EarlyOn in Simcoe.





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Exploring New Foods

Relevant Ages: All

This workshop is designed for parents, caregivers and clinicians to cover a variety of positive behavioural approaches to introducing new foods or expanding food repertoires of children who are picky eaters. Strategies are covered in a practical step-by-step manner to address a range of eating issues.

Improving Sleep

Relevant Ages: All

This workshop reviews strategies that can be used to help children fall asleep and maintain a full night's sleep. Strategies are covered in a step-by-step, practical manner to address a variety of sleep-related issues.

Toileting

Relevant Ages: Preschool and early school age

This workshop is designed to help participants recognize readiness skills and patterns of current toileting behaviours in their children. Participants will also acquire knowledge of toilet training strategies based on principles of Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA). Attendance at this workshop will include a follow-up appointment to personalize strategies taught in workshop.
