

Over the years there have been a number of changes including a name change (in 2018, our name officially changed to EarlyON Child and Family Centres). There are now more EarlyON sites available to parents to access - especially in the most rural areas. Continued research and development helps direct the programs and services we offer to meet the changing needs of the community. 10 years ago - who would have thought we would have been able to offer virtual Zoom circles?!

## THE EVOLUTION OF THE EARLY YEARS PROGRAM IN HALDIMAND AND NORFOLK

In 1998, the Ontario Government commissioned the Early Years Study to learn more about how government, communities, and parents can help children get the best possible start in life. The study found that the years before 6 have the most important influence of any time on a child's development. With the Early Years Study in mind, the Ontario Early Years Centres were "created to ensure that all families in Ontario regardless of income, culture, or special needs have access to early years services that help give children a healthy start in life." (Early Years Study 1).

In 2003, the Ontario Early Years Centres of Haldimand and Norfolk opened their first site in Simcoe, ON. Soon after, sites in Caledonia, Dunnville and Delhi opened - followed by mobile sites spread across both counties (check out that map below!). Fast forward to 2020. Our name has changed to 'EarlyON Child and Family Centres of Haldimand and Norfolk', and we provide services in 12 communities across Haldimand and Norfolk! We are still seen as a community leader, partner, and resource recognized for fostering healthy growth and development in all children, caregivers and families.



## Did you know?

The Simcoe location (12 Colborne Street, North) was once a bank! The vault is still there, used as a storage space right beside our art studio! Have you ever noticed how the wall sticks out there? That's the actual vault door - it was too heavy to move out of the building, so we just built around it! During the first year of operation at that site, people would still walk in thinking it was a bank and ask where they could put their money!

**OEYC Site Location** 




### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Aside from the Play-and-Learn programming still offered, the Centres in 2003 also provided these services: toy lending library (in which a cabinet of toys was kept at most sites for parents to borrow from); parent info line (a call line for parents to contact with any question they may have); car seat clinics (provided at various sites to help fit the car seat into your car properly); informal child care registry (before the OneList existed, we would help you find childcare!); and professional resources (photocopier, die press, laminator - all of which can be found and used at ASCY in Hagersville now!).

In the beginning, we would set out various craft items in the craft area with the intention of the children using only those items to make an art product ('everyone is making a penguin craft today!'). After years of study, research and observations, we now know that doing that limits a child's creativity, imagination and learning. It is what we called 'product-oriented art'.

Now, at the EarlyON Centres, we provide opportunities for children to freely explore the creative studio - using any items they would like. This helps encourage individuality, creativity and independence, and it is what we call 'process-oriented art'.

School is just around the corner - and now's a good time to start thinking of easy lunch recipes that go well in the lunch bag!

### **Broccoli Cheese Cups**

3 cups cooked and chopped broccoli

1 large egg


12 Ritz crackers (crushed)

1 heaping cup of grated cheddar cheese

1/2 teaspoon of garlic powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- 2. In a medium bowl, mix all ingredients together.
- 3. Grease a mini muffin tin and evenly spoon the mixture into the cups (should make about 16).
- 4. Squish mixture down well into the cups. Top off with a little more grated cheese.
- 5. Bake for 14 16 minutes on the centre rack.
- 6. Cool before serving.



## The Early Years Study: Why It's Important To You

The report - first published in 1998 - was a game-changer when it came to the way we talked and thought about young children. It influenced education, parenting and government throughout Ontario and Canada. Here are some of the ways it effects you:

- Based on the recommendations of the Early Years
   Study 1, the federal government expanded
   parental leave benefits from 6 months to one year.
- After the Early Years Study 2 was published,
   Ontario created play-based, full day kindergarten for all four and five year olds.
